

Medication Forms

If your child needs to take any medication in school either prescription or over the counter, a signed medication form must be on file with the School Nurse. The form has a section for the parent to complete, giving permission for the School Nurse to administer medication to your child as well as a section for the physician to complete stating the diagnosis, name of medication and administration instructions to be followed.

All medications **must be brought into the Health Office by a parent or other adult designated by the parent.** It is also requested to supply the Health Office with a small thumb nail picture of your child for identification purposes. If your child will need an over the counter medication, it must be supplied in an unopened bottle or container. If it is a prescription medication, it must be in an original medication bottle from the pharmacy. It is also requested that a labeled empty bottle be supplied to the Health Office in the event your child will be attending a school outing and may need to take his or her medication while out of the building. Your pharmacy will gladly do this for you.

If your child has a severe allergy to any food or bee sting and requires an epipen and antihistamine in school, you will find all necessary form in this folder as well. Please indicate any emergency contacts for your child. Your child's physician should complete the form entitled Food Allergy Action Plan. All other forms should be completed by a parent and returned to the Health Office at your earliest convenience.

NO CHILD IS PERMITTED TO CARRY MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL. ALL MEDICATIONS MUST BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL BY AN ADULT.
